




SCIENCE GRADE LEVEL COMPARISON








NJSLA 23-24 ELA COMPARISON





NJSLA 23-24 MATH COMPARISON






























Strategies & Proactive Practices

Less than 10 students participated in the spring <u>DLM administration</u>.

22 students participated in the spring <u>ACCESS for ELL</u> administration. A passing score is a 4.5 or higher and we had 11 students exit the program, leaving 11 students as continuing/monitoring along with additional newcomers to the program during the 24-25 school year.
